Happy Nurses week! May 6th - 12th



Nurses Week is an annual celebration of nurses worldwide for the work they do for others. The week allows people the chance to acknowledge the nurses in their lives. It also provides an opportunity to thank nurses within the industry as a whole for the work they've done. The history of Nurses Week started when Dorothy Sutherland of the U.S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare sent a proposal to President Eisenhower in 1953 to create an official Nurse Day. About 20 years later, in February 1974, President Nixon created a week to acknowledge the nursing profession. In 1978, New Jersey's Governor, Brendon Byrne, declared May 6th, National Nurses Day. In 1981, the American Nurses Association and other organizations helped make it official. Furthermore, the International Nurse Council declared "International Nurse Day" be May 12th in honor of Florence Nightingale's birthday. Thank you to all of our wonderful nurses here at St. Monica's, we really appreciate you!




