NATIONAL ASSISTED LIVING WEEK

From September 8 - 14, we celebrate National Assisted Living week. The week-long celebration honors Assisted Living residents and the amazing staff that serve them across the country. HISPANIC HERTIAGE MONTH SEPT. 15TH - OCT. 15TH

On September 17th, 1968, Congress passed public law 90-48, officially authorizing and requesting the President to issue annual proclamations declaring September 15th - October 15th to mark the beginning of National Hispanic Heritage Month and called upon the "people of the United States especially the educational community, to observe such a week with appropriate ceremonies and activities." President Lyndon B. Johnson issued the first Hispanic Heritage Week Presidential Proclamation the same day.
